There were 46 survivors, 5 officers and 41 men, including the 2 men taken prisoners of war by the submarine. The following is a description of the manner in which those missing lost their lives, with figures showing the number lost in each instance: One officer and 15 men were killed instantly by the explosion of the torpedo or flying parts. Seven men seen badly wounded before ship sank, possibly drowned. Five men never escaped from No. 1 firerooni. Fifteen men drowned. One officer and 15 men died from exposure on rafts during the night.
